Confessions of a City Boy

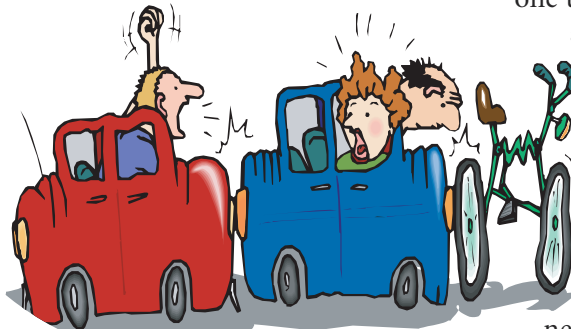

Question: My oldest teenager gets on the Internet and stays on for hours, even past midnight. School grades are suffering as a result. Is there any way a parent can restrict Internet use to a specific time-frame and set daily limits?

Answer: What you need is a parental control program for your home computer. Cyber Patrol, Net Nanny, and Safe Eyes are just a few of the many reputable parental control programs available to restrict and monitor Internet use. Do a little research. Google parental control programs. You will find detailed reviews to make an informed decision. Avoid biased reviews flogging unknown free products. If your home computer has the new Vista operating system, excellent parental controls are included. Here's how to access the parental controls in your Vista computer. Click on Start, Control Panel. Using the new Vista control panel, go to User Account and Family Safety category and click on Set up parental controls for any user. You will be prompted to create user accounts for each child. Designate child or teenager accounts as standard (limited) to prevent installation of additional web browsers, music downloaders, and Internet chat programs not included on the original watch list. As

parent and administrator you hold the keys. Remember to password protect the parent account otherwise junior will undo what you have wrought. Under Parental Controls, click on the child account. Turn Parental Controls ON, and turn Activity Reporting ON. Unless you plan to patrol the home front at night, go to Time Limits section and block computer use between 11:00 PM and 7:00 AM. Click OK to save changes. Next, allow or block specific programs. Choose option labeled "Junior can only use programs I allow". Vista lists all programs currently installed on your computer. Since there are many essential programs, click Check All first. Then, carefully uncheck specific programs to block total access. Uncheck Windows Live Messenger to block any instant messaging via MSN. Vista parental control lacks time restrictions for individual programs. You cannot limit web browsing or chatting while permitting simple homework activities. Parents can adjust web filtering, block specific websites, and (hear the evil laugh!) block downloads. Topping everything off is an excellent activity report. All this is free with Vista. Parental control programs like Cyber Patrol require an annual subscription but offer better features. Money talks.

RECIPE CORNER



Black Forest Cake

Submitted by Dianne Holt

No one could make a black forest cake like my mother.
Thanks Mom for sharing this recipe.

Dry Ingredients:

- 2 C. sugar
- 1 3/4 C. all purpose flour
- 3/4 C. cocoa
- 2 tsp. baking soda
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. salt

Mix together:

- 2 eggs
- 1 C. sour milk (1 tbsp. vinegar in milk)
- 1 C. strong black coffee
- 1/2 C. oil
- 1 tsp. vanilla

Add to dry ingredients.

This mixture will be thin and runny.
Grease 2 layer cake pans, line with wax paper and dust with flour.

Bake at 350 for 35-40 minutes.

DO NOT let them fall in the centre.

Allow cakes to cool.

Slice each cake - laterally using dental floss and draw through cake in a sawing motion.

Rest 1st layer on a cake plate. Sprinkle with 2 capfuls of rum. Spread with 1/3 can of cherry pie filling. Rest 2nd layer on top. Spread with 1/3 can of cherry pie filling. Rest 3rd layer on top. Sprinkle with 2 capfuls of rum. Spread with remaining 1/3 can of cherry pie filling. Rest 4th layer on top.

Cover cake, top and sides, with whipped cream.

Topping: Add 2 tbsp. sugar to 2 1/2 pints whipping cream, or use 1 large pkg. of Nutrawhip

Decorate top of cake with stemmed maraschino cherries.

Chill approximately 1/2 hour

Drizzle melted chocolate over edges.

NORTHERN LIGHTS ENERGY SYSTEMS LTD. was first established in 1986 on a farm just west of Richards Landing on Hwy 548 where it remains today. The business really took off when Laurence and Diena moved into their new energy efficient home which was completely "Off the Grid" in 1991. The passive solar house was built to R2000 standards and uses solar hot water heating, and a unique ground source heating and cooling system. The home and business uses power from wind and solar electricity. They live a lifestyle of sustainable development including their Certified Organic beef farm that does not use pesticides, antibiotics, chemical fertilizers, or commercial feeds.

The projects grew in size and complexity with projects like ACR Canyon Park completed in 1992 which operates on a hybrid solar and water power system. The system at Canyon Park supports staff housing, work center, visitor gift shop, and washroom facilities. One of their more recent projects was the first in the area to sell electricity from solar panels to the utility. Algoma Mutual Insurance CEO Cameron Ross can now point up to the 54 solar modules and show how progressive his company is thinking.

Today their service area covers from Massey in the east to Wawa in the north. Services include design and installation of solar electric, solar water heating, wind power, hydro turbines, automatic back up power systems, generator transfer panels, and other electrical services. Northern Lights is a licenced electrical contractor and Laurence is an inter-provincial licenced construction and maintenance electrician.

The Sun-Link solar tracking device is manufactured on site. This is Laurence's invention that causes the solar panels to follow the sun. It is sold across Canada by approximately 40 renewable energy dealers.

Northern Lights has a showroom with many products on display. It is open by appointment. Laurence is very excited about the future of renewable energy. "I always knew this day would come" Renewable energy was just a curiosity 20 years ago, but now it's going main stream.

McKay said the electrical side of the business is fairly straight forward. It is the customer relations part that is complicated. Everyone has different lifestyles and needs and that's what they are servicing. Yes, people love

their new solar power system, but only if it meets their needs and is trouble free. That's where Northern Lights' design process shines. Much of the success of the business is due to word of mouth. Satisfied customers tell their friends and neighbours.

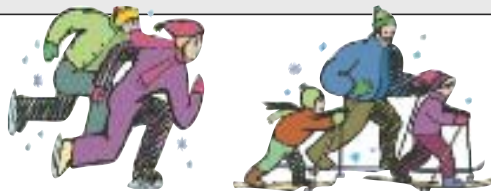

HISTORICAL SOCIETY



Question: Do you know when electrical power first came to the Island?

Answer: Before power officially came to the Island, the Stone Lumber Co, which was founded by W. J. Smith in 1910 on the shore at Marksville (Hilton Beach), was generating their own power to run their mill, office and factory which produced dowels and broom handles. At the same time they also supplied power to the business section of the village. This continued until the early 1930's.

In 1919 Great Lakes Power Co. was supplying power to the steel and paper mills, as well as the city of Sault Ste. Marie. They then began to build lines to Echo Bay and other communities east of the Soo, including St. Joseph Island. The cable to the Island was put in at Kensington Point and reached across Campment D'Ours Island and up to the 'F&G' Line on St. Joseph Island, where a substation was established.

On August 20, 1933 Great Lakes Power announced that power would be cut into their system at Richards Landing with forty services, both commercial and domestic. Service had already arrived the previous week at Hilton Beach for about the same number of customers. Over the next years, power was gradually extended to various areas of St. Joseph Island. In late 1938 negotiations were taking place to bring electricity to the Kentvale area. The cost would be determined by whether only the Kentvale Hall would be connected or if the Hall and the Kentvale Store would both receive power. It would require six poles to bring power from the existing power line on the 'A' Line. Poles were to be procured and put in by the customers. Both establishments would be charged the commercial rates; a minimum of \$30 per year or \$2.50 per month for each.

In 1947, street lights came to the village of Richards Landing, and they appeared at about the same time in Hilton Beach as well. In 1953, when the Island's single ferry operated at the site of the present bridge, the power lines were established in that area.

Gradually over the years, poles, supplied by customers, were installed and power reached more and more neighbourhoods, with some areas not being connected until the late 1950's and early 1960's. However, some outlying areas have only received power within the last few years, and a few still rely on an alternative source of power.

Annie Littleton's husband, the late Delmer (Tinker) Littleton, worked for many years for Great lakes Power. She has in her possession letters, pamphlets, newspaper clippings, etc. which have been the main source of our information, along with the recollections of other Islanders.

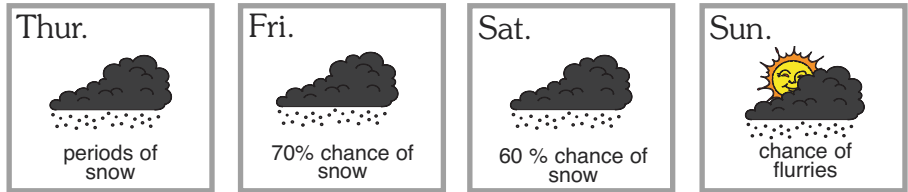
