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## Protect your Family from Fire!

THAT'S THE THEME OF THIS YEAR'S FIRE PREVENTION WEEK, which runs from October 9 to 15.

Originally designated to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire of 1871 in which an estimated 300 people tragically perished and some 18,000 buildings were destroyed, Fire Prevention Week is now focused on reducing the number of injuries and fatalities from fires – and on preventing fires in the first place.

Each October, Fire Prevention Week enables Fire Departments across the province to organize a variety of educational fire safety activities within their communities.

The theme emphasizes the importance of Ontarians taking responsibility for fire safety in their own homes. Fire Departments across the province will focus on a variety of fire safety measures to help Ontario families protect themselves from fire, including:

### Preventing cooking fires:

According to the Ontario Fire Marshall, the leading cause of residential fires in Ontario is unattended cooking! Prevent these fires by staying in the kitchen when cooking. Don't get distracted!

### Installing smoke alarms:

It's the law in Ontario to have working smoke alarms on every storey of

the home and outside all sleeping areas. Test your smoke alarms every month and change the batteries at least once a year or whenever the low-battery warning chirps.

### Developing a home fire escape plan:

You could have only minutes, perhaps seconds to escape a fire in your home. Develop and practice a home fire escape plan so that everyone knows what to do if a fire occurs.

It is important for everyone to be vigilant in taking some appropriate safety measures to help protect your family from disaster. Smoke alarms are your first line of defense against a deadly fire. The sound of a smoke alarm is your warning to leave the building. By developing a fire escape plan - and practicing it - you will be prepared to react if a fire strikes.

Over the last several decades, modern home construction has made house fires more deadly than ever. Newer homes and furnishings are made of more synthetics that make fires ignite faster and release more toxic gases. This has reduced

the escape time from over 15 minutes to less than 5 minutes and makes escape plans even more important.

As we head into the winter season, it's important for those with wood burning units to have your chimney cleaned and inspected by a professional. I recently installed a carbon monoxide detector in my home - yet another tool to help warn of

dangerous conditions in your home. But remember that these are NOT a replacement for smoke detectors.

Fire Protection on St. Joseph Island is provided by three different Fire Departments. As Fire Chief of the Hilton Union Department, I have been privileged to see a closer collaboration between our department and the Jocelyn Fire Department. With our 'Automatic Aid' agreement, we ensure that both departments respond to all calls in the Village of Hilton Beach, Hilton Township and Jocelyn Township – regardless of municipal boundaries. This ensures the quickest response time and best service for all residents and property owners. With time I hope we can have an island-wide agreement that sets a new standard for rural fire protection with the seamless integration of all fire resources on the island.

This is an exciting time for our local Fire Departments. The Jocelyn Fire Department has recently added a new Pumper Truck and soon, the Hilton Fire Department will be upgrading our aging Pumper.

All volunteer departments struggle to find new members and need your help. In Hilton, we are currently recruiting new members who can serve a variety of roles. On the emergency scene, we need people to help with support, tracking firefighters, controlling traffic, safety, driving trucks, water shuttling, pump operations and more. We have important tasks for everyone; from students to retirees, and will gladly train you to be part of the team.

Many people don't realize that the rules, regulations and standards of all Fire Departments in Ontario are the SAME. We train under the same guidelines as someone who works for a full-time Fire Department. Over 90% of all Fire Departments in Ontario have volunteers on staff and over 60% of all firefighters in the Province are volunteers. If you can spare two nights a month for training, there IS a role for you at one of our local Fire Departments – please come out and join the team.

They will be performing at the Riuniti Hall in the Soo on Thursday, October 20th and then – yes! - they'll be here on the Island on Friday, October 21st, putting on what they're calling a "Honky-Tonk Dance" at the Legion Hall in Richards Landing!

We've always thought that there are really only two kinds of music lovers: those who love 'The Breakmen' and those who simply haven't seen and heard them yet. If you're one of the latter, then you really should find out what all the buzz is about! If you're one of the former, we know where YOU'LL be on Thursday or Friday night, or maybe both nights!

It's hard to stick a label on this fabulous foursome of amazingly talented singers, songwriters and musicians - Matthew Lawson, Ben Rogalsky, Lee Watson and the Island's own Archie Pateman. What started out as an adventurous bluegrass quartet has fast become a sharply focused roots music outfit that, in their own words, "owes as much to The Band and Blue Rodeo as it does to John Hartford and Bill Monroe".

With a strikingly original repertoire and a lively on-stage show, the Vancouver-based Breakmen are in hot demand at festivals and clubs across the country. They've released three critically acclaimed albums, and are known throughout North America as some of the finest song writers and performers in their genre. All three of their albums have made the song charts across the country, each hitting #1 at some point on Canada's Earshot Charts. They've won an International Music Award for best Roots Album (When You Leave Town,

2008), and have been nominated twice for Canadian Folk Music Awards.

Now, they're even experimenting with electricity! One of their new signature songs "Back to the Start" leaves no doubt that you CAN mix drums, electric guitars and amplified fiddles with traditional acoustic bluegrass instruments, and still arrive at as rich a harmonious blend of sounds as their hauntingly beautiful early classic "Sweetheart of the Rodeo".

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

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# RECIPE CORNER



## Gail Duffield's Blueberry Cake & Butterscotch Sauce

3 C. flour  
1 C. sugar  
1 Tbsp. baking powder  
1 tsp. soda  
1/2 tsp. salt  
grated rind of 2 lemons

Mix together and add:

1 can skim evaporated milk  
1 tsp. oil  
2 eggs, lightly beaten

Add 1/2 of batter in bottom of greased 9 x 3" pan. Add 2 cup blueberries then remainder of the batter. Bake at 350°F for 40 to 45 minutes.

1/3 C. sugar

1/2 tsp. cinnamon

2 Tbsp. lemon juice.

Mix together and while warm drizzle on cake. Cut into serving size pieces.

## Butterscotch Sauce

1 C. brown sugar  
1 tsp. margarine  
1 Tbsp. corn starch  
1 Tbsp. water vanilla  
2 C. water

Boil all ingredients until slightly thickened. Pour over individual pieces of cake.

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

## Our Autumn Leaves

Have you been enjoying our leaves in their fantastic fall colours? Here in Algoma, we've been blessed with a veritable painter's palette of colour, everywhere we look. But contrary to what many people believe, it's not the dropping temperatures that are responsible for our glorious autumn leaves. It's more about daylight and photosynthesis.

Like everything else in nature, plants and trees are quite amazing and perfectly engineered. They've often been referred to as nature's food factories. They take water from the ground through their roots, and carbon dioxide from the air through their leaves and through the miracle of photosynthesis, they use sunlight to turn them into oxygen and glucose (sugar), providing their own food for energy, health and growth.

Leaves also contain chlorophyll, which helps make photosynthesis happen and gives plants and leaves their green summer colour. As summer ends and autumn arrives, the days get shorter and the ground gets drier. The reduced amount of water and light makes photosynthesis slow down and eventually stop.

The green chlorophyll disappears from the leaves. As the bright green fades away, the yellow, orange, brown, red and purple colours that have always been there (but unseen because of the green chlorophyll) begin to emerge.

In many trees, glucose or wastes are trapped in the leaves after photosynthesis stops. Sunlight and the cool nights of autumn turn this glucose red. Wastes like tannin turn brown, carotene turns orange and xanthophyll turns yellow.

Somehow it just seems so much nicer to set the 'science' aside, and just admire this marvel of nature while it lasts!

## A Very Bizarre Murder Case!

*Thanks to Dave Gerhart for sharing this rather bizarre story about a rather bizarre suicide ... or murder. You decide! Although the email circulating this story claims it to be a true Associated Press article, it is unfortunately, just a 'tall tale'. But it's a pretty interesting tall tale, so we present it anyway, for your enjoyment!*

At the 1994 annual awards dinner given for Forensic Science, (AAFS) President Dr. Don Harper Mills astounded his audience with the legal complications of a bizarre death. Here is the story:

On March 23, 1994, the medical examiner viewed the body of Ronald Opus and concluded that he died from a shotgun wound to the head. Mr. Opus had jumped from the top of a ten-story building intending to commit suicide. He left a note to the effect indicating his despondency. As he fell past the ninth floor, his life was interrupted by a shotgun blast passing through a window, which killed him instantly.

Neither the shooter nor the deceased was aware that a safety net had been installed just below the eighth floor level to protect some building workers and that Ronald Opus would not have been able to complete his suicide the way he had planned.

The room on the ninth floor, where the shotgun blast emanated, was occupied by an elderly man and his wife. They were arguing vigorously and he was threatening her with a shotgun! The man was so upset that when he pulled the trigger, he completely missed his wife, and the pellets went through the window, striking Mr. Opus.

When one intends to kill subject 'A' but kills subject 'B' in the attempt, one is guilty of the murder of subject 'B.'

When confronted with the murder charge, the old man and his wife were both adamant, and both said that they thought the shotgun was not loaded. The old man said it was a long-standing habit to threaten his wife with the unloaded shotgun. He had no intention to murder her. Therefore the killing of Mr. Opus appeared to be an accident; that is, assuming the gun had been accidentally loaded.

The continuing investigation turned up a witness who saw the old couple's son loading the shotgun about six weeks prior to the fatal accident. It transpired that the old lady had cut off her son's financial support and the son, knowing the propensity of his father to use the shotgun threateningly, loaded the gun with the expectation that his father would shoot his mother.

Since the loader of the gun was aware of this, he was guilty of the murder even though he didn't actually pull the trigger.

The case now becomes one of murder on the part of the son for the death of Ronald Opus.

Now comes the exquisite twist...

Further investigation revealed that the son was, in fact, Ronald Opus. He had become increasingly despondent over the failure of his attempt to engineer his mother's murder. This led him to jump off the ten-story building on March 23rd, only to be killed by a shotgun blast passing through the ninth story window.
