And the event includes more than just walking. There are also vendors' booths, displays, activities for participants and spectators like a digital Scavenger Hunt and 'Clowning Around Obstacles'. There's even live entertainment. That's an awful lot packed into those 12 hours!

It all starts off with cancer survivors, wearing distinctive yellow T-shirts, walking a 'Victory Lap' around the track accompanied by the applause of friends and family, followed for the rest of the night by their teammates, walking in relay shifts. We've heard of several walkers doing 20 or 22 laps and a few even doing over 50 laps! And it's wonderful to see our own Cathy Read - accompanied by her husband Brian and good friend Carla Richardson, out there as well!

St. Joseph Island was very well represented at the event. While some Island residents participated as members of Sault-based teams, St. Joe also once again proudly fielded two teams of its own: the 9 member 'Island Girls' under Captain Rita Cloutier and the 8 member 'Island Red Hats' under Captain Anna McMillan.

While the final numbers aren't yet in, the 2012 Relay For Life raised over \$250,000, thanks to the efforts of the relay teams and their sponsors. And our Island teams did a tremendous job in contributing to that success. The 'Island Red Hats' raised a total \$2,100, while the 'Island Girls' jumped up into the Top Five Teams, raising \$7,097, in donations. Both teams have expressed their thanks and appreciation to their generous sponsors and supporters.

Congratulations to you all! Every step you took helped to save someone's life.



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Farewell, Marg Kent

Like many other residents of the Island and beyond, the Foxes stopped by Holy Trinity Anglican Church on Saturday, June 9th, to pay our respects to the family of Marg Kent, who passed away suddenly on June 6th.

Although nobody else seemed the least bit surprised, we were amazed to learn on arrival that we'd have a 40 minute wait to do that! There were so many visitors that the church simply could not hold them all at one time. Those that couldn't fit inside had to wait for someone else to leave, which resulted in a lineup out the door, down the walkway, then along the road. And the lineup lasted all afternoon, right up to the funeral service at 5 pm.

Being the kind of people they are, Ron Kent and his family did not remain inside the church, as folks stood in line outside on a sunny, hot day. Instead, they all came outside to greet the throng of well-wishers. When hundreds were reaching out to them in their time of sorrow, they were reaching back.

In speaking with others in the line, we were also deeply touched to learn that several Island businesses had closed for at least part of the day, so that their staff could also attend.

It was clear that Margaret (Priddle) Kent had indeed touched many, many lives.

Born in Echo Bay and growing up in Sault Ste. Marie, Marg was exposed very early in life to the Priddle family's devotion to education; her mother being a teacher and her father, a school principal. In the early 1950's, unlike today, there was a desperate shortage of qualified teachers. Marg, along with several of her friends, was recruited right out of high school to help fill the gap.

In 1952, having just turned 18, she had completed her summer training and found herself in front of a classroom in Goulais River Public School, teaching kids who seemed (to her at least) to look older than her!

For the next five years, the young woman taught at schools in the Soo, including King George School, which she left when her father was appointed principal. During that time, she also devoted a year to Teachers' College in North Bay.

Then came the fateful day in 1957 when, on an Anglican Young People's Group outing, she met a "super-shy kid from the country", a quiet young lad by the name of Kent, from St. Joseph Island. And the rest, as they say, was history! "Actually, it wasn't anything dramatic; like love at first sight or anything", Ron tells us with a shy smile. "We discovered that we had both attended Sault Collegiate at the same time, but because we were in different grades, our paths never crossed, or if they did, we didn't notice."

Marg and Ron married two years later, in 1959. "I'm not a fast mover," he chuckles. "We took our time and got to know each other very, very well." Marg was also able to start teaching on the Island, although she found the 'one room schoolhouse' environment to be too stressful. Then came some new additions to their fledgling family, and Marg never returned to the classroom. She was far too busy on other fronts, starting with the arrival of their first child, David!

"I don't think she really loved teaching", says second-born Colleen. "She did love our family business ... and our wonderful neighbour/customers. She felt our staff was an extension of our family, and she LOVED working with all of her family."

"She LOVED my Dad." Colleen continues. "For over 50 years they were best friends. They lived together, worked together, worshipped together and parented together. They loved to travel and have flown to islands, cruises and overseas. In their motorhome, they've gone North, South, East and West. And East and West and East again, because they loved the East coast."

Younger sister Amy adds her own perspective: "My mother and I do have a lot of similarities - we're both teachers, we both adore our families, we both love cats and we both have a horrible sense of direction. But the highest compliment I could be paid would be to say that I'm a lot like Margaret Kent."

Now, the funeral and the gatherings are past, and 'life goes on' for the Kent family. Outwardly at least, Ron is holding up well, still going about his life with his usual quiet dignity. "I've been very lucky to have so many 'thank you' cards to write" he

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confides. "It keeps me very busy. It's good therapy." And the common thread of what Marg and Ron's four children have to say is simple and from the heart "We love you, Mom."

It's a sentiment shared by all who knew her. Margaret Kent has truly touched us all.

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



RECIPE CORNER



A recipe from a former Island girl Betty Cruickshank. She and her sister Nancy are not only wonderful cooks, they share their recipes eagerly, many of which were passed down from their mother, Mary Nelson.

Betty Cruickshank's Rhubarb Muffins

- 2 1/2 cups flour
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 1/2 cups packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup oil
- 1 egg
- 1 cup buttermilk or (1 cup milk, 2 tbsp vinegar)
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 2 cups rhubarb, finely chopped (about 3 large stalks)

Mix flour, baking soda and salt. Set aside. In a large bowl, combine the rest of the ingredients and mix well. Add the dry ingredients and mix until moistened. Fill 12 large, greased muffin cups with the mixture

Topping

- 1 tbsp butter, melted
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon

Blend the topping ingredients together and sprinkle on the muffins. Bake @ 350 for 20 minutes.


