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# WHAT is the \*^&% hurry?!

## A Plea for Some Common Sense

OVER THE PAST FEW WEEKS, your humble publishers have been getting an earful from readers about “close calls” on our local roads and how the Island Clippings should once again remind drivers about basic road safety practices - and yes, let’s call it driver etiquette - in the summer driving season on the island. We can certainly relate to those concerns! We have them too. Sometimes drivers just don’t seem to know any better .....

For example, the driver of the brown Toyota Camry who passed us at breakneck speed on the freshly-gravelled Base Line last week, raising a dust cloud 300 feet high and showering our car with stones might be surprised to learn that I was NOT waving happily to him! I was, in fact, using a quite different hand gesture!

No matter what your opinion might be on the merits or evils of cold mix road surfacing, there’s a good reason to observe the posted reduced speed limits in areas with loose gravel. Aside from the obvious safety issues, isn’t it simply good manners to show a little consideration for oncoming drivers and their vehicles by slowing down when approaching them? For that matter, why drive so fast on loose gravel in the first place?

Stones kicked up by your vehicle are like bullets that you fire – damaging to vehicles (including your own) but potentially lethal to cyclists, pedestrians and animals.

Although we don’t condone it, we can certainly understand the lure of sometimes excessive speed. With our comparatively light traffic volumes, open rural roads and – dare we say this – low odds of being caught in a police radar trap, it’s just so easy to let the speed build as we drive.

But the road isn’t necessarily as “open” as it can sometimes appear! The odds are fairly high that you really are NOT alone on the road! Even an empty-looking open country road is usually teeming with wildlife just out of sight, including the deer that’s about to leap out right in front of you with no warning. Often, that ‘open road’ is a traffic accident that’s just waiting for one key ingredient to come along: you.

And it’s not just wildlife at risk. Just 3 days ago, I watched in shock from 20 feet away as one pickup truck towing a house trailer, doing well over 100 km was being passed by another trailer-towing truck going MUCH faster – both roaring by our driveway within 3 feet of our young granddaughter who was standing at our mailbox.

That isn’t the ‘lure of the open road’. That’s just plain, unthinking, uncaring and unforgivable stupidity.



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# ST. JOSEPH ISLAND MUSEUM MOMENT

It is apparent that our museum reaches many more than we think. In fact one day, while assisting Pat with a few artifacts, two lovely ladies walked in. Judy Alexander hailing from Stowe, Vermont and cousin Elizabeth Rae who hails from Richards Landing proceeded to enquire about a few items and enjoyed the new 1812 display within the main building.

Judy then mentioned that her grandfather was James Walker. Mr. Walker had passed away in 1951 she continued and he happened to be an amateur archaeologist. In light of this information, a most interesting conversation began with Pat. They discussed the many trips to the St. Joseph Island Fort that Mr. Walker had made. These ventures in archaeology resulted in many digs on the historical island site.

As a highlight, Judy presented Pat with letters from various individuals and organizations pertaining to communication between officers at the fort during the early 1800's. Included was an article about Mr. Walker's collection of artifacts found and how they seemed to tell "the whole story" of the Fort. Items such as 'buttons of various regiments, pieces of old hand cut iron nails, medals, clay pipes, knives, bits of wine glasses and much more', were just some of the treasures that Mr. Walker unearthed.

A December 19, 1928 article in the Sault Star titled, "What Sault Man Dug Up At Old Fort St. Joe", tells about a man that was a passionate supporter of the history of St. Joseph Island. So much so that on a few occasions, he stayed for two weeks exploring and mapping out the remains of the buildings. In fact, Mr. Walker had stated that if a museum should ever be built on the island, he wanted his artifacts to make their home there.

Judy Alexander left Pat with the commitment that she would bring in some of these artifacts that her grandfather so lovingly collected. It will no doubt bring us all a renewed, shared enthusiasm for the place where St. Joseph Island as we know it began.

### Drowning Deaths and Water Safety

by Inspector Mark Andrews

This morning I sat down to face my computer screen to read incident notifications. It's something I do everyday and it is not an easy task since many of the notifications detail someone's death. Most often it is a fatal car crash or the natural death of an elderly person. It could be an industrial accident or less frequently, the loss of life in an act of violence. But this morning, it was the drowning death of yet another child – a toddler barely old enough to walk. The day before, a young boy drowned. Sadly, similar tragic circumstances for both – a moments in attention - it all happens so quickly.

I feel deeply for the families and my heartfelt sympathy goes out to all. I know how difficult these calls are for police officers and emergency personnel. Bystanders who witness the tragedy and communities as a whole are left traumatized.

Hot weather, water and kids – a day at the beach or poolside should be fun summer memories in the making. I can only urge parents and caregivers to be vigilant in and around water.

Focus on the children's activity and don't let distraction catch you off guard. Lifejackets for non-swimmers are a safety measure that does not reduce the need for strict supervision.

When in and around the water, lead by example - always consider safety first. A recent death by misadventure and a leap from a cliff saw a young man drown.

This past weekend a wake jumping personal watercraft crashed into a boatload of family members and the boat driver was ejected and injured.

Fishermen fall overboard unexpectedly while fishing alone - without a PFD it's often with deadly results.

Recently, the true measure of the value of wearing a life jacket while boating was strongly demonstrated when three people were left floating in Lake Superior for three hours after their boat sank. Had they not been wearing a life vest it might have been them in my death notifications.

There is no one single cause that leads to drowning but there are common contributors. Basic safety practices such as learning to swim at an early age; wearing a lifejacket or a PFD while on a vessel; adult supervision of children while swimming; and not drinking and boating can make the difference between surviving, or not.

## Nancy Hachey's Chocolate Mayonnaise Cake

- 2 C flour
- 1 C white sugar
- 1 1/2 tsp. baking soda
- 1 1/2 tsp. baking powder
- 4 tbsp. cocoa
- 1 C. cold water
- 1 C. mayonnaise
- 2 tsp. vanilla

Mix the dry ingredients in a large bowl. Mix water, mayonnaise and vanilla. Pour over dry ingredients and mix well. Pour into a greased 9x13 pan. Bake @ 350 for 35 minutes. When cool, ice with chocolate icing.

### Chocolate Icing

- 3 tbsp. butter
- 3 tbsp. cocoa
- 2 tbsp. hot water
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 1 1/2 C. icing sugar

Cream butter. Blend in cocoa. Add hot water and vanilla. Add icing sugar and beat until creamy.

TIP: To avoid lumps, sift the cocoa and icing sugar through a fine sieve colander.

In a state of shock and panic it would have been much more difficult to face an hour drive to the next closest emergency department. Every single member of my immediate family and many extended family members have required the services of the hospital over the years. The hospital is a vital and valuable asset to this community. We must continue to advocate for its survival. *Pam Lefave*
