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
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Mark Henderson Addresses Landowners' Meeting

LAST SATURDAY FEBRUARY 9TH, MARK HENDERSON once again stepped into the cross-hairs of public scrutiny, sure to draw either criticism or credit. The outspoken Reeve of Jocelyn Township was a key speaker at an Ontario Municipal Information seminar in Cobden, Ontario, located in Renfrew County, in the Ottawa Valley near Pembroke.

Hosted by the Renfrew Landowners Association, in conjunction with the Ontario Landowners Association, the seminar was designed to provide municipal officials from throughout Renfrew County with information on the rights and responsibilities of Municipal Councils in implementing provincial legislation. In total, 22 Mayors, Reeves and Councillors took part, as well as the area's Member of Parliament Cheryl Gallant and MPP Jack MacLaren. Also speaking later in the program were OLA Director of Research Liz Marshall and municipal and property law specialist Terrence Green of Green & Associates Law Offices.

At the heart of Landowners Association activities is the protection of landowners' rights against perceived encroachment by provincial legislation, regulations and municipal bylaws. OLA maintains that many provincial regulations, which local municipalities must enforce through their own bylaws, are not even valid under 'Common Law'. Based on its own research into a number of Government Acts, the OLA contends that some municipalities, being "misled" by the Provincial government, have passed bylaws which are actually



illegal and which could even put them at risk of lawsuits by property owners.

The subject is, to say the least, highly controversial. Many, if not most municipal leaders are perhaps unaware of – or are simply not convinced by - the OLA position on what it maintains are numerous conflicts and contradictions within the Ontario Municipal Act.

There simply isn't room here to cite chapter and verse, but the 'magic words' about which we've heard a great deal are "Letters Patent, Land Grants or Crown Grants". Basically, these are the land or property grants given by the British King (the Crown) to the original settlers. Unless otherwise specified, the use of the land being granted was left to the recipient of the Grant. The Grant also applies to any future owners of the property.

Each and every subsequent owner of the property enjoys the same rights as the original owner – rights which cannot be changed or revoked by any other law or regulation put in place by a future government (which is also referred to as 'the Crown').

Is it a valid interpretation? Will it hold water in federal court? Is federal court even the proper venue to test it? That's way beyond our ability to judge or foretell, but it has become a very hot debating topic in the past few years.

The fundamental principle of property owners' rights however, seems to be striking a resonant chord with many

modern landowners. And it's not limited to owners of large tracts of land. Many own just the ground their home is on, but they don't like to be told what they can or can't do on it or with it. These landowners are listening, and are now also speaking out themselves.

A strong 'landowner rights' activist himself, Reeve Henderson conducted his own exhaustive research into what he perceives as the many problems at the provincial level and how they spill down to the municipal level, and ultimately onto the head of the individual property owner.

"I was growing more and more concerned that many elected officials make decisions and pass laws, based on what they are 'told' by provincial bureaucrats and have not necessarily researched for themselves the accuracy of what they're being 'told'. I did the research!" he states firmly.

And that started the ball rolling. He brought his concerns to Council and after weeks and months of sometimes heated discussion accompanied by further research and more heated discussion, Jocelyn Township broke new legislative ground by passing three key resolutions, aimed directly at protecting the rights of its landowning citizens:

The first ratifies and formalizes the concept of "Recall" as an inalienable right for citizens of Jocelyn Township. In essence, 2/3 of eligible voters can, at any time, remove any or all councillors, including the Reeve from office prior to the end of their term in office. This would force a new election, without having to wait for an 'election year' or the expiry of the incumbent's term.

The second resolution decrees that no council shall remove any property owner's rights or uses, listed or implied in the original contract (Crown Land Patent or Deed) between the Crown and the original land owner or their heirs and assignees, without written permission or unless instructed by a court with the proper jurisdiction in Crown Land Patents.

The third resolution specifies that the first two motions must be passed by a 2/3 majority vote which, at Council's July 2012 meeting, it did, passing the resolutions into law. But even that wasn't enough for Reeve Henderson. He's taking it to the people of Jocelyn, seeking confirmation and ratification by an affirmative referendum later this year. "This would ensure that no future councils could overturn these guiding principles without the overwhelming support of its ratepayers. We've put the power back in the hands of the people." he smiled.

Since that historic vote, Jocelyn Township has leapt into the forefront of the "Rural Revolution" that seems to be springing up across the country, grabbing the attention of landowners' and citizens' rights groups like the Ontario Landowners' Association, each in their own way aimed at "pushing back" against what they see as pervasive government interference and manipulation.

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In October 2012, Reeve Henderson was featured on a popular talk show aired by Ottawa radio station CFRA. In that segment, Host Nick Vandergraagt and his listeners learned a great deal more about Crown Land Patent Grants than anyone other than a contract law expert would otherwise know or dream of!

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

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

ON SATURDAY JANUARY 19TH, after more than a year of fundraising, Jocelyn Firefighters took possession of their latest piece of rescue equipment, the Hurst "Jaws of Life" combination tool.

This compact combination spreader and cutter tool is very efficient with immediate response and, unlike earlier generations of the tool, it offers total mobility with no hydraulic hoses to hook up and drag around. It delivers heavy hydraulics in a battery powered tool or it can run all day by a generator. It has the fastest opening and closing times of any such tool and is ideal for use in confined spaces like a building collapse or working around an accident scene.

Members of the Hilton Union Fire Department also took part as a trainer from the supplier, "Code 4 Fire & Rescue Inc." from Hagersville, Ontario provided demonstrations and training, to certify the members of both departments in its use.

After a morning of classroom instruction at the Jocelyn Number 1 fire hall, the firefighters went to Don's Garage for hands on instruction in the use of the equipment. Special thanks to Don who supplied the autos and an area to conduct the training.

With this latest tool and new pumper trucks, both Jocelyn and Hilton Union fire departments continue to upgrade and modernize their equipment and are better equipped to handle any emergency that may arise.


