

Towers are going up in Hilton Beach, atop the South Street hill, on the C Line near Sailor's Encampment and another near the 20th Side Road and the F&G Line intersection. The remaining two are located in Jocelyn township on the 5th Side Road near Jocelyn Drive and on the P Line and A Line junction near Otter Lake.

So far, the sites have been cleared and graded, foundation concrete has been poured and the initial wiring has been installed. Now, the towers themselves are going up, eventually to reach 61 metres high. It's not yet confirmed whether all construction is planned to continue over the winter.



Although our winter weather will no doubt have an effect on progress, Bell Mobility officials are confident that all construction will be completed on schedule for the towers to go "live" by next summer, and possibly as early as the Spring.

We watched in awe as the veteran construction crew (with full safety gear of course) seemingly effortlessly climbed, moved all about and leaned both in and out, at already-dizzying heights, getting things ready for the next section to be lifted.

Once again we warn that, if you receive such an email, DON'T DO IT! Don't click on the link and don't reply to them. Give the message what it deserves and delete it right away.

Coffee Filters - Who Knew!

And you can buy 1,000 at the Dollar Store for \$1. even the large ones.

1. Cover bowls or dishes when cooking in the microwave. Coffee filters make excellent covers.
2. Clean windows, mirrors, and chrome... Coffee filters are lint-free so they'll leave windows sparkling.
3. Protect China by separating your good dishes with a coffee filter between each dish.
4. Filter broken cork from wine. If you break the cork when opening a wine bottle, filter the wine through a coffee filter.
5. Protect a cast-iron skillet. Place a coffee filter in the skillet to absorb moisture and prevent rust.
6. Apply shoe polish. Ball up a lint-free coffee filter.

11. Prevent a Popsicle from dripping. Poke one or two holes as needed in a coffee filter.

13. Put a few in a plate and put your fried bacon, French fries, chicken fingers, etc on them.. It soaks out all the grease.



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Another Fire on the Island

TOWNSHIP OF ST. JOSEPH FIREFIGHTERS were called to the north end of the Island on Monday night to deal with a fire in a detached garage. St. Joe Fire Chief Fraser Adams reports that the fire was not detected until the garage was partially collapsed and completely involved. As a result it was a complete loss. Several pieces of equipment were destroyed including a tractor and various implements. Another small, nearby building was also damaged by the heat. The cause is still under investigation but is not considered suspicious.

As of our press time, no new information is available yet from OPP and Ontario Fire Marshall officials about their investigation into last week's deadly fire on the X Line.

Please remember to dial 9-1-1 in case of fire or other emergencies. We've learned that, over the past few years, there have been several calls that reach the island fire departments second or third hand. Instead of dialing 9-1-1, people are calling a friend, or someone they know who is a member of the fire department. Perhaps the caller doesn't wish to risk embarrassment, but it causes confusion and delays – and those extra few minutes can make a world of difference in response times.

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RECIPE CORNER



Teresa Parker's Magic Cake

4 eggs (separate yolks from whites) at room temperature

1 tsp. vanilla extract

3/4 cup sugar

1 stick butter, melted

4 oz or 3/4 cup of all purpose flour

2 cups milk lukewarm

powdered sugar for dusting cake

1. Preheat oven to 325 F degrees. Grease a 8 inch x 8 inch baking dish.

2. Separate eggs and add the egg whites to a mixer and mix until egg whites are stiff. Place egg whites in a bowl and set aside.

3. Beat the egg yolks with the sugar until light. Add butter and vanilla extract and continue beating for another minute or two after which you can add the flour and mix it in until fully incorporated.

4. Slowly start adding the milk and beat until everything is well mixed together. Add the egg whites, a third at a time and gently fold them in using a spatula, repeat until all egg whites are folded in. Another variation to folding in the egg whites would be to add a third of the egg whites and gently whisk them in to the cake batter, then reverse the process and add a bit of the cake mixture to the egg whites and gently whisk in, repeat until all cake batter has been whisked in.

5. Pour batter into baking dish and bake for 40 to 70 minutes or until the top is lightly golden. The baking time could vary greatly depending on the oven, so take a peek at around 40 minutes and see how it looks.

6. Sprinkle some powdered sugar after cake has cooled.

Serve it chilled with berries ... The center of the cake is actually a custard.

SAH Creates Innovation Fund

GOT ANY BRIGHT IDEAS FOR HEALTHCARE?

Perhaps the years of belt-tightening and streamlining are paying off as the Sault Area Hospital (SAH) announced Monday that it had generated a surplus of \$1.3 million over its fiscal 2012/2013 budget. Actually, the total surplus was closer to \$2.8 million. About \$1.5 million of that went toward paying down the hospital's long-term debt, leaving the net surplus of \$1.3 million.

That money will be reinvested back into the hospital's programs, services and people. Following discussions with the SAH Board of Directors, it was decided that the surplus would be best reinvested in the form of an Innovation Fund.

"One of the Peer Review recommendations coming from our 2010 Hospital Improvement Plan was that it wasn't enough to balance our budget but that it should be our goal to generate ongoing surpluses to pay down long term debt." said Mario Paluzzi, SAH's Director of Communications and Public Affairs. "Last year, our Board made that a requirement moving forward and this will be the third year that we have been successful in doing so. As a matter of fact, we are forecasting a surplus greater than the \$1.5 million and another Board resolution was that additional surpluses beyond the budgeted amounts should be reinvested in the hospital, our people and services to our patients. The Innovation Fund is one such means of allocating this additional surplus."

The Fund is non-recurring and will support one-time expenditures. The objective of the SAH Innovation Fund is to support Board-approved innovation opportunities, including education and capital investment proposals that will continuously improve the quality of care and patient experience at SAH.

Any organization or individual in the Algoma District may submit a proposal/application to access the Innovation Fund. Proposals must also align with SAH's Mission, Vision, iCcare Values and corporate hospital goals.

In order to determine a process for allocating these funds, an Innovation Fund Committee was developed in 2013. Consisting of hospital staff, physicians, volunteers and community members, the group represents a cross-section of both the hospital community, as well as providing a perspective from the community at large. The Committee is fittingly chaired by Tom Vair, Executive Director of the Sault Ste. Marie Innovation Centre.

The deadline for submission of an initial proposal and application is January 20, 2014. The Innovation Fund Committee will then review, evaluate, rank and prioritize all submissions. Applicants will be informed by the Committee if their initial submission is successful and if so, will be asked to provide a

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“Ice Bridge” to Open Soon



DRUMMOND ISLAND, MI — U.S. Customs & Border Protection, Office of Field Operations reports that conditions are good for the time of year when the “Ice Bridge” forms between Canada and the United States.

The ice bridge was scheduled to be marked with signs and the tree line on Saturday, January 11, 2014. *[Publisher’s Note: Poor weather conditions forced this to be postponed]* Once the ice bridge is established, CBP will begin staffing the reporting station on Friday, January 17, 2014. The opening and closure of this reporting station is subject to change contingent on weather and ice conditions.

“The ice bridge is a fun recreational link between the United States and Canada,” said Port Director Patrick Wilson. “Because of the continued reduction in snowmobile activity at the reporting station, the hours of operation will mirror those of the 2013 season.”

Travellers entering from Canada must report directly to the reporting station on Drummond Island during the established hours of 2 p.m. to 10 p.m. Friday through Sunday.

The number of days that the reporting station is open has been reduced due to the low volume of people using the ice bridge. The Drummond Island reporting station will be closed this year Monday through Thursday.

The official CBP Reporting Station is located at the Drummond Island Yacht Haven Dock. Entering at any other location or outside of these hours is prohibited and violators could be assessed a \$5,000 fine.

Planning ahead can expedite your crossing:

- Proper documents include passports, passport cards, enhanced driver’s licenses and CBP’s Trusted Traveler Cards - NEXUS, FAST and SENTRI.
- Be prepared to declare merchandise purchased or acquired in Canada.

- Declare “Duty-Free goods” even if purchased at “Duty-Free” stores.
- Before leaving for the trip, obtain a “Know Before You Go” brochure available on the CBP Web page, www.cbp.gov.
- Do not attempt to bring unauthorized fruits, meats, and dairy products into the United States.
- Do not attempt to import prohibited items, such as Cuban cigars. A complete list of restricted/prohibited goods can be obtained at www.cbp.gov.
