



Return of a Polar Vortex?



BRRRRR! AFTER A FEW WEEKS of fairly 'moderate' winter weather, it seems that, once again, we've been plunged into a deep freeze, as this week's daily temperatures are expected to drop significantly below what we've come to think of as 'normal' for this time of year. And it's not just us here in Northern Ontario. It's also happening in Southern Ontario and, in fact, right down into the U.S. Midwest and through both the American northeast and southeast, where they're seeing record low temperatures.



And of course, we're once again hearing that oh-so-familiar line "due to a mass of cold air coming down from Canada." So who or what do we Canadians blame in turn? Why, the Arctic of course!

Although we're no weather experts, we have been hearing quite a bit lately about a phenomenon known as a Polar Vortex being the cause of this huge deep freeze. More specifically, a distorted Polar Vortex. It's not really a 'storm' like a winter hurricane, but it can be the cause of some pretty nasty weather as its offspring.

As its name suggests, a Polar Vortex is the circulation of strong,

high altitude winds in the troposphere and stratosphere around the Earth's poles. It's really a huge, dense polar low-pressure system that, in the northern hemisphere, spins in a counterclockwise direction. These winds tend to keep the bitter cold air locked in the Arctic regions. Sometimes however, the upper-level winds that make up the Polar Vortex decrease in strength, allowing the vortex to expand and oscillate, usually resulting in a jet stream that plunges deep into southern latitudes, bringing the cold, dense Arctic air spilling down with it.





The experts call this an Arctic Oscillation and it can switch from a positive phase, with strong upper-level winds, to a negative phase with weaker winds, a few times per year. When that happens, it can bring major cold air outbreaks throughout the northern hemisphere ... and when it happens in winter, it can get seriously frosty – as in ‘Niagara Falls freezing over’ kind of frosty!

Although sometimes referred to as a ‘polar cyclone’, it’s not really a storm, but a cold air outbreak caused by the Polar Vortex is much more widespread and can last much longer than a single storm. Widespread drops in temperature, lead to the development of significant winter storms, especially when the cold air is advancing into a previously warm region.

Last March for example, much of Europe recorded their coldest temperatures in over 50 years. The cause? Polar Vortex. Here in North America, the first two weeks of the new year brought us a cold slap in the face, while places farther south had their ‘coldest weather’ and snowfall records shattered. What caused it? Right! Polar Vortex!

Now, meteorologists in the American northeast are nervously watching their computer models, as the possibility of another vortex rears its ugly head, just in time for the NFL Super Bowl XLVIII at the MetLife Stadium, just outside New York City ... the first Super Bowl in history that will be played outdoors in a northern city. If the weather models hold, bitterly cold temperatures should descend on the city the week before the big game ... and stick around for a while.

Environment Canada is presently expecting that this new blast of dense Arctic air will hit Ontario, Quebec and Manitoba with much-colder-than-normal temperatures, but things won’t likely be as cold as early January, when wind chills hit -50 C in some regions. Toronto, for whom the average temperature at this time of year is -2 C, is forecast to hover around -20 C. The bitter cold will likely stick around Ontario



and Manitoba until the end of January but continue to hang over Saskatchewan and Alberta until mid-February.

Our recent bouts of cold weather have also had a major impact on the Great Lakes and the shipping industry, which in turn has significantly affected the steel industry, which depends heavily on a steady supply of raw materials - iron ore, coal and limestone, all of which come by ship.

Bitterly cold winter weather caused the St. Mary's river and the Straits of Mackinac to start freezing over in late November, the earliest in recent history. Since early December, many Islanders have been able to watch American and Canadian Coast Guard icebreakers opening up the shipping channel, only to have the ice re-freeze as soon as the ships passed by.

According to the U.S. National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and the Canadian Ice Service, Lake Michigan is now more than 35 percent frozen over, a level of iciness at this time of year that has not occurred in five years.

In an average winter, about 55 percent of Lake Michigan's surface gets covered with ice. This year, the extreme cold may freeze as much as 62 percent, and perhaps more. Lake Erie, being much shallower, is already reported to be close to 90% frozen over, while Lakes Superior, Huron and Ontario appear to be following a similar trend in freezing faster and farther than usual.

There's not much you can do to prevent these occasional blasts of extra-wintery cold air, aside from staying warm inside and, when you must go out, to dress appropriately for cold weather and extreme wind chills. After all, we're Canadian! With all due respect to our friends down south who are lining up to buy emergency supplies and learning how to drive in snow and ice, we still think of it all as just 'winter'.

These polar vortices and the horrible winter conditions that they cause have been around for a long, long time. Our own parents, as we all know, regularly walked 20 miles each way to and from school, in minus 40 degree weather, hip deep in snow, and uphill both ways to boot! And that was in July!

"Community gardening is a holistic activity," says Sean Cosgrove, an urban planner in Toronto who has written on the subject for 10 years. 

Don't Just Shiver...Entertaining Yourself during the Polar Vortex

The cold is bringing out the amateur scientists. Throwing boiling water into the frigid air is a popular experiment. One person found that when you put boiling water in a Super Soaker it becomes a freeze ray. But if you're going to do this, please be careful! You can burn yourself badly.

Make Snow

When very hot water reaches very cold air, the water vaporizes, and some of it turns into small chunks of ice. Snow, basically. This can lead to camera-friendly visuals. The temperature should be -21F (-29.4C) with a wind chill of -51F (-46.1C),

Be careful make sure the wind is blowing away from you and throw the water away from you not over your head, so you don't burn yourself. Kids don't do this at all get your parent to do it for you and you can take the pictures.

MUCH SAFER...Make Ice Bubbles

Take bubble solution out into the cold and make an amazing series of frozen-bubble photos. They have been widely shared these last few days. The science is pretty simple: the water

freezes in the bitter air but the soapy solution allows it to retain its bubble form. As soon as you touch them though, the heat from your fingers will melt the bubble. The largest of them make for great photos while the smallest ones can roll around on the ground like tiny marbles.

Be Careful of your Pets & Livestock

Veterinarians say the smaller the animal, the higher the risk of freezing to death. In dogs and cats, shivering and lethargy are the first two signs of trouble.

“The smaller you are, the more body surface you have, and the quicker you will lose body heat,” said Dr. Douglas G. Aspros, immediate past president of the Illinois-based American Veterinary Medical Association.

Subzero wind chills have been widely registered and they are a big factor because wind strips heat from pets faster.

If you need to warm a shivering animal, a quick and easy way is to heat a towel in the dryer and wrap it around them.

Rule of thumb: If you don't want to be outside for an extended period of time, your pets probably don't want to be either. Very cold weather can be deadly to dogs and cats.

Frostbite is the biggest concern for animals that are living outside during a blast of frigid air like the one that has descended on the area.

That's why straw is just as important for animals this week as shelter from the wind, access to water and extra food that gives them energy to keep warm.

A thick layer of straw will help horses in stalls, calves or heifers in a hutch and any other animal seeking a way to stay warm.
