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Eleanor Adcock Turns 90

ON NOVEMBER 27TH Eleanor (Garside) Adcock will turn 90. Over her many years, her interests in writing, gardening, history, and community service have come together in many ways to make a difference in our local quality of life.



Writing has been a common thread and ongoing passion for Eleanor. Starting as a teenager, she expressed her romance with nature in her very Canadian poetry. Many people remember her articles in The Island Clippings and North Shore Sentinel. While her news column on local people and events helped create a sense of shared authentic community, her articles to preserve local history eventually became My Little Book of St. Joseph Island Stories.

When Eleanor married Russell Adcock in 1946, she joined him in a market gardening business. Together they supplied consumers in the Sault with fresh St Joe Island garden produce such as corn, beans, and squash. That continued on a part time basis while living in the Sault from 1956 through the '60s. Eleanor earned her Master Gardener designation through correspondence studies at University of Guelph, and shared that knowledge repeatedly at the Horticultural Society and with visitors at Adcock's Woodland Gardens.

Beginning in 1985 Eleanor worked with Russell and her son Grant to design and build Adcock's Woodland Gardens. She played an important role particularly in planning and designing the gardens and selecting plants. Every year over 2,000 people from Algoma and abroad visit the Gardens enjoying a few moments away from a hectic world. In private, she still keeps her own vegetable garden for the table.

Eleanor's community service began as a schoolgirl helping out at fall fairs and as a young woman with the Women's Institute. Beginning in 1943 she joined the war effort by serving in the RCAF -WD (Women's Division) at Rockcliffe Manning Depot. She served as a nursing aid to 1946, usually drawing blood samples from returning troops at the women's RCAF hospital. For this she earned the rank of Corporal.

Through the years she volunteered countless hours and donated baked goods to raise funds for organizations such as United Church Women, Mathews Memorial

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Hospital, Island Museum and the Harvest Festival. She shared her knowledge of history with the Historical Society. She also found time while raising her family to volunteer at the Sault's crisis prevention phone line.

Eleanor worked with the Chamber of Commerce as an advocate for tourism and economic development and in many ways helped raise the public profile of Old Fort St. Joseph. She has also been outspoken on the improvement of logging and forestry practices and other issues.

Over the years Eleanor has given freely to the community, even while raising five boys. Her writings on local history, her landscaped gardens and volunteer work have helped make St Joseph Island a warmer, more inviting place. And yes, kids, she really did walk three miles to school, sometimes barefoot in summer and sometimes through darkness, howling wolves and two feet of snow!

On Sunday, November 27th friends and family are invited to Eleanor's 90th birthday party at the Legion Hall at Richards Landing, from 2 pm to 5 pm. There will be a Come-and-Go tea with a special event at 3 pm for half an hour. Best wishes only.

A Close Encounter

WELL, FOLKS, IF YOU'RE READING THIS, the scientists were right.

As predicted, Asteroid 2005 YU 55 passed within 323,469 kilometers (201,000 miles) of the earth early Tuesday evening.

"It is the first time since 1976 that an object of this size has passed this closely to the Earth. It gives us a great — and rare — chance to study a near-Earth object like this," said astronomer Scott Fisher, a program director with the National Science Foundation, during a Web chat with reporters.

The orbit and position of the asteroid, which is about 1,312 feet (400 meters) in diameter, is well known, added senior research scientist Don Yeomans, with NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, California.

Scientists suspect YU 55 has been visiting Earth for thousands of years, but because gravitational tugs from the planets occasionally tweak its path, they cannot tell for sure how long the asteroid has been in its present orbit.

Computer models showing the asteroid's path for the next 100 years show there is no chance it will hit Earth during that time, added Yeomans. "We do not think that it will ever impact the Earth or moon (but) we only have its orbit calculated for the next 100 years," he said.

NASA is working on a mission to return soil samples from an asteroid known as 1999 RQ36 in 2020, followed by a human mission to another asteroid in the mid-2020s. Japan also plans to launch an asteroid sample return mission in 2018.

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This November, be the somebody who saves a life!

IF YOU WITNESSED A FAMILY MEMBER in cardiac arrest, would you know what to do?

November is CPR Month and the Canadian Red Cross challenges everyone to get the training they need to help save a life. Effective bystander CPR, when used in conjunction with an AED and administered immediately following cardiac arrest, can double a person's chance of survival.



"Knowing how to help a person suffering from cardiac arrest can mean the difference between full recovery and permanent disability or even death," says Don Marentette, manager of national first aid programs for the Canadian Red Cross. "CPR training teaches people how to recognize signs and symptoms of cardiovascular emergencies and how to respond quickly and effectively."

Red Cross CPR courses also include training on the use of automated external defibrillators (AEDs): how to assess a person in cardiac arrest, determine whether defibrillation (a shock to the heart to restore normal beating) should be performed, and use an AED unit to deliver a shock if required. The Red Cross is the only national training agency to include AED training as a mandatory component in all their programs.

Polling conducted last year by the American Red Cross revealed that 25 per cent of respondents had been in a situation where someone may have needed CPR, but only 66 per cent of those were confident they could help someone who needed it.

"Training not only gives you the knowledge and skills to respond, but also the confidence to act," says Marentette.

The Red Cross First Aid and CPR/AED program was updated in 2011 to meet the latest international scientific evidence on first aid and CPR released in 2010.

"Seventy per cent of cardiac arrests happen at home, yet only one in seven people know how to perform CPR," says Don. "Knowing these simple techniques could mean the difference between life and death for someone you love."

pulse spanning the distance between the mists of English folk balladry and Middle East mysticism, through to the Mississippi Delta and the rustic wonders of the Appalachian Hills, with a certain fearless reverence and no small amount of soul." (Ottawa Xpress)

Born into a folk musical family in Calgary, Alberta, Cara played with dulcimers and autoharps while her peers played with Barbies and Nintendo. Music was an integral part of her growing up experience. In her early twenties she struck out on her own, recording two EPs and the Prairie Music Award-nominated album Tempting the Storm (2000) which signaled the arrival of a major talent.

Based in Winnipeg, Cara has become a widely-respected and well-traveled member of the Canadian folk/roots music community. She has graced the stage at Lilith Fair and been invited to perform at the prestigious International Guitar Festival in the UK. With The Wailin' Jennys she created one of the most talked about folk groups of the last ten years and recorded the exquisite 40 Days, winner of the 2005 Juno award for Best Roots Recording (Group). Since leaving the trio she has wowed audiences and critics with her solo performances across North America and Europe.
