classic 1926 Eagle.


The possibility of rain was very real with the forecast initially calling for thunderstorms late morning, but as is the tradition, rain was avoided much to the delight of

not only everyone in the parade, but the many spectators who gathered in the streets.

After the parade, the tractors were on display in the Legion parking lot, where inside the pancake breakfast / brunch was packed to capacity with the line literally out the door by the time the trot was done.

Tractor owners were around to answer questions and show off their tractors to other enthusiasts, and everyone got a good meal on the holiday. Inside, Jeanne Arthurs MC'ed, telling the history of the Tractor Trot, how it started 23 years ago with 4 friends Llloyd Schell, Gerry Hawdon, Gord Hawdon and Ed Arthurs going for



coffee at Anne's Café (now known as Camille's) and the tradition of tractors trotting into Richards Landing has now been done by some 350 drivers, including 25 new drivers this year with hundreds of spectators year after year.

During the parade, members of Don Levesque's family rode his tractors with hand painted signs in memory of him. Don passed away on June 28th. Jeanne describes him as "A generous, thoughtful, helping, caring member of the community. He was a yearly participant and generously donated prizes year after year. He special ordered unique bottles and had them filled with island syrup for the lucky winners to enjoy. He worked all year at the tractors he would bring to the Tractor Trot."

She goes on to say, "This year would have been no different but life had other plans for this generous caring soul. Our community is greatly feeling his loss. Don is not here but his tractors and his spirit have joined us for the day. Thank you Don for all that you have blessed us with."



## ST. JOSEPH ISLAND MUSEUM MOMENT

The St. Joseph Island Museum is presenting a new event! The museum will be hosting Old Time Thursdays July and August. The first of this 6 part series is July 11th at 2 pm. Walk through history alongside costumed interpreters and learn more about each of the buildings on site. The first part of the series is the Church. Join us under the big tent after for a glass of lemonade and a butter tart. Admission is by donation. Below is a museum moment written by Cindy Crawford who was an acting curator from 1998-2000. She did an excellent job compiling information about each building and creating an interesting and informative column and I think they deserve another read.

I've always been intrigued by old stone churches. These old buildings represent a cross section of historical elements, the labour involved in erecting them, the fact that the building of a church recognized the settling of a community plus the social and spiritual role of the church in people's lives. With all of this history within its walls, it seemed only appropriate that the former Zion United Church was donated for use as a museum. Located on the corner of the I Line and the 20th Side Road, the Zion Church was donated by the church board to the St Joseph Historical Society in 1963. Over the years it had served several generations of families but the time had come where it was no longer practical to keep the building operating as a church.

Early pioneer Ben Garside was the stone mason who erected the natural stone walls. According to the St Joseph Island Pioneer, published by the St Joseph Island Historical Society in June 1990, volunteer labour was also provided by the Brydens, Cummings, Bishops, Fyfes, Hartens, Harrisons, Irwins, Pollocks, Reeds and McDonalds. The steel braces were later installed in the 1970s, to stabilize the walls.

Sault Star clippings capture the opening ceremonies of the long awaited museum. During the opening ceremonies, Mrs. WL Armstrong, then president of the Historical Society, paid tribute to the former Women's Association of Zion United Church. Over the years, these women raised money towards the upkeep of the building. Mrs. William Cain cut the ribbon to officially open the museum. Her personal association with the church was extensive- she was a former member

of the Zion United Church congregation, a member of the Women's association plus a church organist for many years.

It seems appropriate that this first museum building continues to house many artifacts that were the first of their kind to arrive on the Island. According to notes written by the late Ada Tranter, long time curator of the museum, some of those firsts include the hospitals first wheel chair, the first piano on the Island and the first municipal printing press.

The Sault Star article included comments made by Rev. Roy Jordison, a former United Church minister who served the Zion congregation. He appealed to other local churches "to compile their histories for the museum as part of the cultural background of the Island." Over the years, the museum has gratefully received numerous commemorative booklets, old bibles, pews, hanging lamps, donation records and personal recollections pertaining to the history of the Island churches. At almost a century old, the stone church continues to "serve" the people of the Island, acting as a keeper of artifacts of those early pioneer days.

#### THE TOWNSHIP OF ST. JOSEPH LANDFILL SITE CHANGES TO CREATE IMPROVEMENTS

"How can we improve the landfill site to provide better service to users?" was a question recently posed to The Township of St Joseph Council. Council tasked the Landfill Advisory Committee to work with municipal staff to find and implement solutions to issues at the landfill site.

As an example, a resident complained that traffic became snarled on Saturdays when users attempted to access the recycling bins at the same time as others wanted to use the Share Shed, and some simply wanted to reach the tipping face. The Committee recommended that the recycling bins be reversed so users could access them on the way out of the landfill site. Council agreed, and implemented the change on the May long weekend. While there are some growing pains as users adjust to the new traffic flow, feedback has been very positive. Additional directional signage will be installed within the coming weeks to advise users of traffic flow and parking.

The Township operates the landfill site under strict operational standards set by the Ministry of the Environment. The Ministry regularly monitors activity at the site and makes periodic changes to the operational plan. They can impose penalties if the Township does not adhere to these requirements. For example, the Ministry has recommended more frequent placement of cover material over household waste, which serves a number of purposes. In the past, this service was contracted out, but the Township recently acquired an excavator to provide cover more frequently and at lower overall cost. The excavator will also be available to perform other construction and road projects as the need arises.

The Master Plan for the Landfill Site is designed to minimize leaching from the site. To accomplish this, the tipping face is required to be relocated from time to time. Such a move is planned to occur before the end of the summer season. The new tipping face for household waste will be created closer to the Share Shed along the existing tree line, while the tipping area for non-household waste such as construction materials, will be accessed via the newly constructed roadway beyond the scrap metal pile. Exact timing for moving the tipping face location is expected to occur before the end of the summer.

In the meantime, the Landfill Committee urges users of the landfill site to plan their visit expecting to deposit household waste first and access the recycling bins on the way out of the site. Landfill stickers are required, and demonstrate that the persons dumping have the right to do so.

The landfill site is an important and costly piece of community infrastructure that is often taken for granted. The challenge is to make the site as efficient as possible, and to be something of which we can all be proud.

#### **Giant Water Bug**



This isn't the greatest picture of a specimen, but we hope we never get a chance to take another picture of one of these as long as we live. This is a Giant Water Bug, otherwise known as a Toe Biter, and you can only imagine how it earned that name. Lethocerus americanus are freshwater insects that live in slow moving waters, ponds and marshes all over the world, the family Belostomatidae, and there are as many as 170 species worldwide. Other names include Indian toe-biter, alligator ticks and alligator fleas. They are considered a popular food in parts of Asia.

They can grow as big as 4 and half inches, but we're sure this one that we found on our deck was the size of Mothra. They have flattened oval shaped bodies with wings, which means these nasty things can fly, and their front legs are modified into pincher-like appendages that they use to grab their prey. Once they grab their prey they stab them with their sharp proboscises and inject a venomous saliva. Their bites can be painful, but cause no medical alarms. If they are disturbed by humans they are more likely to swim away if in the water, or play dead if they are on land. They mostly eat insects, snails, fish, amphibians and crustaceans but larger specimens have been known to feed on baby turtles and water snakes.

Adults die over winter, and the eggs the females laid, over 150 in their lifetime, will hatch into nymphs in about two weeks. Most nymphs do not survive to adulthood due to cannibalism or predators.


