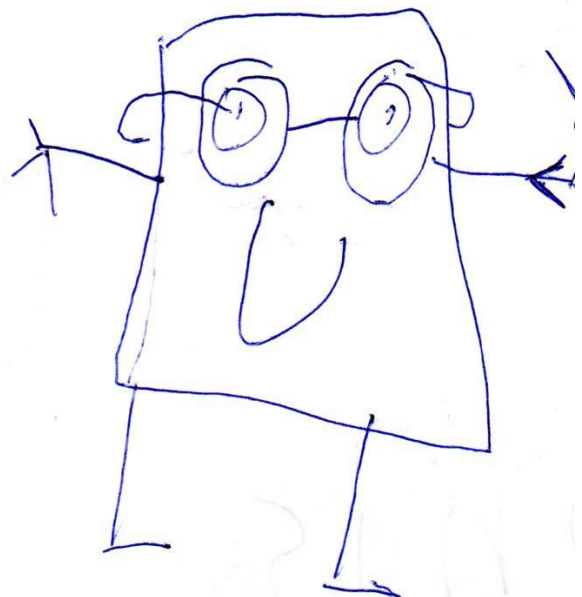

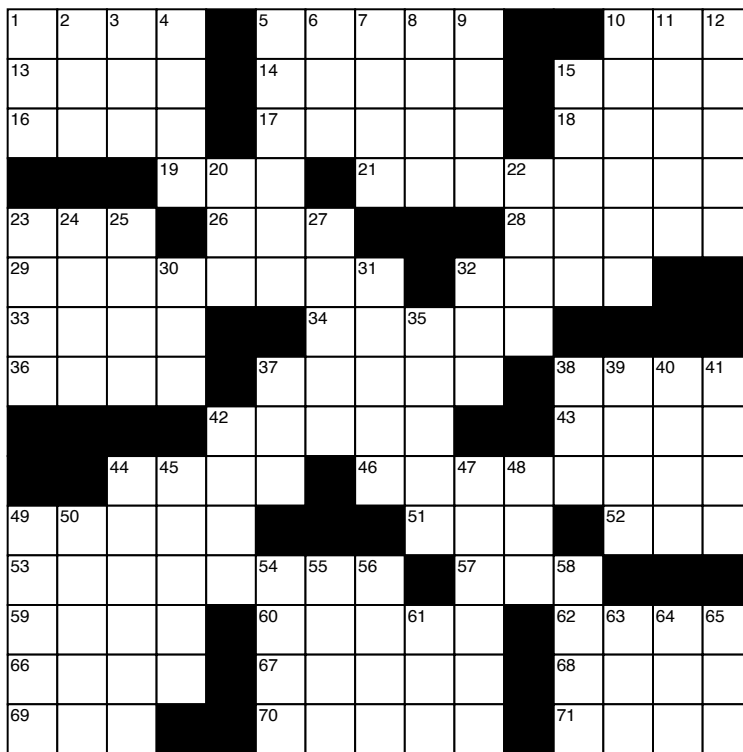

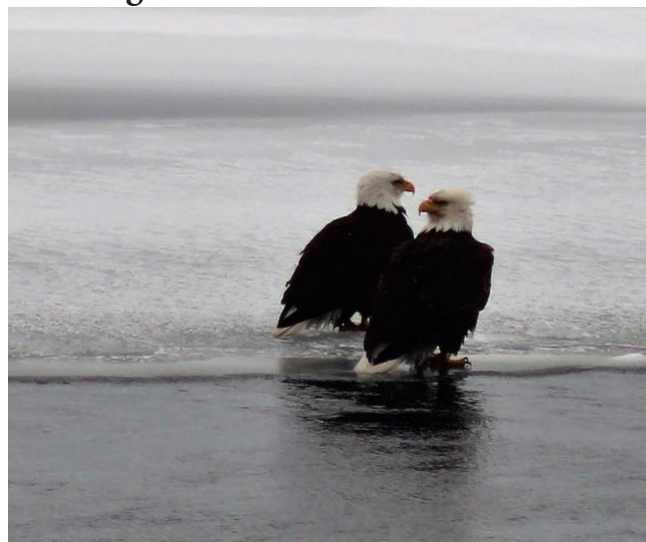

## Creature Feature

### Bald Eagle



The emblem of the United States, as well as being a sacred bird in many North American cultures, the bald eagle is one of the most recognizable raptors in the world and Canada's largest bird of prey. Their range covers most of Canada, Alaska, the lower 48 states and northern Mexico.

While their diet consists mostly of fish, bald eagles will prey on water birds and mammals. They often scavenge the leftovers from prey of other predators such as bears and wolves. Probably the most common places to see bald eagles on the island are the dumps.

Bald eagles reach maturity at five years old and are thought to keep the same mate for life, however if the mate dies, the other eagle will search out a new mate. They usually lay eggs in late February in the largest bird nests in North America. Sometimes the nests can be as big as 10 feet long and 20 feet wide and weighing 2 metric tons.

The bald eagle's population began to decline in the 20th century, with the loss of nesting habitats and decrease of prey. They are opportunistic hunters and would sometimes prey on livestock, resulting in many birds being shot. The use of the pesticide DDT after World War II had devastating effects on the bald eagle's populations, causing the adult females to lay eggs with thin brittle shells. By 1963 there were only 487 nesting pairs of bald eagles in the contiguous United States. The bald eagle has thrived under protection and the banning of DDT in 1972 in the U.S., and was removed from the list of threatened and endangered species in 2007.

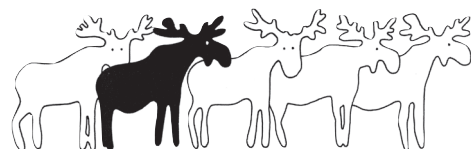
