



#### We've Found Some Golden Oldies - Apples That Is

Last year was very challenging for the Algoma Lost Apple Project but, with help, we did manage to sample and tag one of the oldest surviving orchards on St. Joseph Island. And we found some treasures. As Paul Kron, Research Assistant at the Dr. Brian Husband Lab at the University of Guelph puts it, "We saw things we hadn't yet seen anywhere else, including Charlamoff, a winter-hardy Russian variety good for both cooking and eating fresh, and Hibernal, a tart, astringent apple suited for saucing or drying." Another Algoma find is Liveland Raspberry (AKA Lowland Raspberry), an early-maturing apple that we know was being sold from the Tait Nursery in 1916. Donna Hadden (nee Haight) tells me that the Liveland was her favourite apple growing up.

According to the publication Fruit Trees of Ontario 1906, "Charles Young, Richards Landing, Ont." recommended growing in Algoma District for "Commercial and Domestic: Astrachan, Transparent, Duchess, Charlamoff, Gideon, Longfield, Wealthy, Scott Winter" varieties of apples. Three of these, we have yet to find – Gideon, Astrachan and Longfield. It would also be lovely to find a Peach of Montreal and/or a Shiawassee, both of which were sold by Tait.

It is my hope that with the help of volunteers, we will be able to collect samples from perhaps a couple of hundred old trees in orchards that still exist just here on St. Joseph Island. Once the samples have been taken and properly dried, they will keep for years if necessary, until we can secure funding to have the DNA testing done. Individuals can still do this and pay the \$20 per tree fee to have their tree(s) tested. One of the volunteers in the group,



can help guide you through the process. If someone does go ahead on their own, it would be appreciated if they would let Paul Kron know that he can share the results with the Algoma Lost Apple Project. He wouldn't need to give us any identifying information as to location or ownership.

As Paul put it in his letter of support for our funding request, the Ontario Heritage and Feral Apple Project being conducted by the Dr. Husband Lab at the University of Guelph "is a project with a strong citizen science component, with the general objective of improving our knowledge about the distribution of abandoned orchards, historic trees, and native crabapples (Malus coronaria) in Ontario. We are interested in the persistence of heritage trees, and the interaction

between feral apples (trees growing "wild" from seeds) and both commercial plantings and native populations. Aside from compiling data about tree and orchard locations, we provide a genetic testing service that matches trees of unknown identity to known cultivars in our database. While we do not directly test for traits associated with specific uses (e.g. cider or dessert apples), the results provide identification of less common cultivars and parental information for feral trees, including trees that may have caught the interest of local groups because of their appealing characteristics. The results also give insight into historical planting patterns for a region, all of which may be of interest to local grassroots business and cultural groups. The Algoma project has already inspired another group in the Haliburton area to launch a similar project."

Another goal is to obtain soft wood cuttings from the owners of the heritage trees that we have found to start new trees by grafting them onto hardy rootstock. That way they will live on.

We would welcome information and interest form owners of old orchards on the mainland as many old orchards grew there. Perhaps you know what varieties your tree are. That would be great. 


