Possible Distemper Infections in Raccoons

The Village of Hilton Beach is warning residents about raccoons potentially suffering from distemper. Distemper is a viral disease that can affect many different mammals such as raccoons, skunks, coyotes, foxes as well as others. While we humans are safe, unvaccinated dogs and cats can catch the disease. With summer quickly turning to fall, raccoons may look to backyards for easy meals

They have not yet received results back from tests of deceased raccoons, but the village is working with the MNR, Algoma Public Health and the Canadian Wildlife Cooperative. We spoke with Jillian Hayes, clerk treasurer, about how the village is taking this matter very seriously. She tells us the village has contacted a trapper and is hoping live traps may slow the spread of the deadly virus, which typically peaks in the fall about every 5-7 years. She also wanted to share this message:

"Keep yourselves and your pets away from wildlife. The best way to get rid of the carcass of an infected animal is to double bag it and dispose of it at the landfill. Village staff will be available during regular business hours to provide access to the landfill as needed. In the case of an emergency, we are suggesting residents get in touch with the Mayor or a Councillor in order to dispose of the animal in a timely manner".

While this applies to people living in the village of Hilton Beach, raccoons obviously don't only inhabit certain municipalities on St. Joseph Island, and if these raccoons do test positive, then it's possible to encounter them in any of the other municipalities. It would be a good idea to make sure your dogs and cats are up to date on their vaccinations, especially

if they spend time outside unsupervised.

Distemper symptoms in canines include watery and puss-like discharge from eyes and discharge from nose, fever, coughing, lethargy, reduced appetite and vomiting. The virus attacks the nervous system, so infected animals will begin to circle and tilt their heads to the side, their muscles will twitch and convulse, they will salivate and have seizures. In wildlife, distemper symptoms resembles rabies.






